My dear Sir:

Our School Physician has reported to me that he has had to treat Manuel Romero for a case of venereal trouble that is just about cured, but because it has been decided not to allow boys in that condition to remain at Carlisle this year his return home will have to be effected. Manuel should pay for his transportation home and an amount which can be used to reimburse the government for what was expended in bringing him to Carlisle.

As near as it can be determined now an amount of \$66.91 will be required to cover the two amounts.

Manuel came to my office yesterday and requested me to recommend the transfer to his credit here of his "Sioux Benefit" money, and in view of the fact that the government should not be required to transport him to and from school it is hoped you can co-operate with me at once to make funds available from some source.

My dear Mr. Brennan:

Manuel Romero, a pupil enrolled at this school from your agency, has been giving a great deal of trouble here since his return, September 12th. I am informed that Manuel made a very fair record here during his previous term of enrollment, and there was no hesitancy in placing transportation for his return this fall. Somehow he started in bad from the very beginning this year and all efforts to get him to see the importance of taking advantage of his opportunities appear to be without avail. This morning he told the disciplinarian that during the summer vacation he was continually in bad company at home, and that on his way back to Carlisle he stopped in Omaha and there left the rest of the party and went down town and associated with women of ill-fame, and then when he got to Carlisle instead of coming out to the school he met two other boys down town, and they went to Harrisburg, and he loafed around about two days before he showed up at the school.

Several weeks ago in making a thorough examination of all the boys, our physician discovered that Manuel was afflicted with venereal disease. According to Manuel's

story he contracted this disease in Omaha. He has, however, been practically cured of this so that there is no longer any danger of serious results. He told the disciplinarian this morning that it was no use for him to make any more promises that he would do better for he could not do it. He refuses to go to School or to do anything he is told to do and shirks every duty and responsibility that is placed upon him. There seems to be nothing further we can do for him here, and I believe about the best thing that could be done would be for his father to have him returned home and put him to work on the farm. I hardly think it would be a proper charge for the Government to pay his expenses home under these circumstances, As the fault is all his own and he refuses to cooperate with us to improve his conduct. Please bring this matter to the attention of his people and let me have your recommendation regarding Manuel.


