Dear Sir:

Referring to the application of Mr. J.L. Morton for the enrollment of Chickilla Fishinghawk, Cherokee Roll No. 19269, in the Indian School at Lawrence, Kansas, I thought it might be possible that this ^{boy} ~~girl~~ would desire transfer to Carlisle, which school is now open for pupils of the Five Tribes on terms the same as at Haskell Institute, except that transportation expenses must be paid by the pupil where the latter has funds for such purpose. Should the pupil be entirely without funds a certificate to that effect from your office would enable the Carlisle authorities to furnish transportation and incidental expenses.

A party leaves here for Carlisle on the Katy Flyer on the afternoon of September 15. If authorized to change the application to Carlisle and if the pupil were here not later than the morning of the 15th, the transfer could be effected. Very prompt action will be necessary if this is desired.

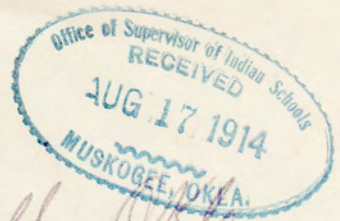

We, the undersigned, respectfully request that leave of absence be granted -----
 [Chickilla Fishing Hawk]
 from U. S. Indian School Carlisle to Steiwell Oala to
 enable him to visit his home. We hereby agree to pay all expenses, including
 round-trip railroad fares, sleeping-car fares, meals, lodging, stage fares, telegraph and telephone messages,
 and other incidental expenses connected with the visit. We further agree that said pupil shall be
 returned to the Carlisle school on or before the last day of the leave of absence.
 We further agree to deposit with the superintendent of the school sufficient money to defray all expenses
 to be incurred, and should the pupils, or any one of them, fail to return to school at such time as may
 be agreed upon by the parents or guardian and the superintendent of the school in which the pupils
 are enrolled, the amount of money remaining with the superintendent, necessary to the return trans-
 portation of the pupil or pupils so neglecting to return, shall be forfeited to the Government; provided,
 however, that in all cases where it can be shown that there were justifiable reasons for the failure of the
 return of the pupil the forfeiture of the funds shall not take place.

If the pupil neglecting to return is from a reservation, the superintendent of the reservation shall
 certify to the reasons for the nonreturn of the pupil or pupils. If a pupil's home is not on a reservation,
 then the certificate of some reputable, disinterested citizen of the community may be requested as to
 the reasons for the nonreturn of the pupil or pupils.

Dear Mr. Lipps:

Referring to your communication of the 23d ultimo transmitting certain correspondence and lease executed by Chickkilla Fishinghawk, in favor of F. W. C. Boesche, I have to advise that this matter was referred to Probate Attorney J. M. Lynch for appropriate action and attention.

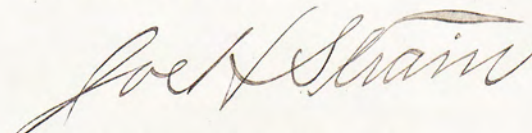
The Probate Attorney has submitted a report dated the 23d instant in which he states that the guardian has informed him that the land is leased at this time for the year 1915, that the allottee will become of age September 1, 1915 and he believes it would be to the best interests of the minor not to make another lease at this time, but let him execute a lease on the land himself after reaching his majority.

In this connection I would respectfully suggest that you call the attention of the allottee to the large number of frauds that are being perpetrated on restricted al-

lottees in securing leases and other instruments affecting the title to the land and urge him to execute no lease or other instrument without first conferring with the Field Clerk or other Government representative relative to same, and execute instruments in his presence only. It is believed if the allottee will heed these instructions, that a desirable tenant can be found for his land and a higher rental received for his land than he himself would be able to secure.

The correspondence, together with the leases, is enclosed herewith. I would respectfully suggest that you have the allottee destroy the leases.

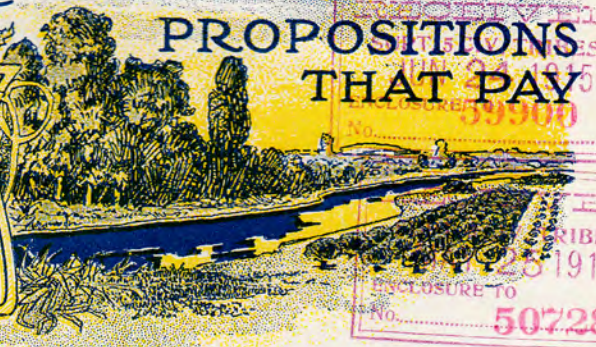

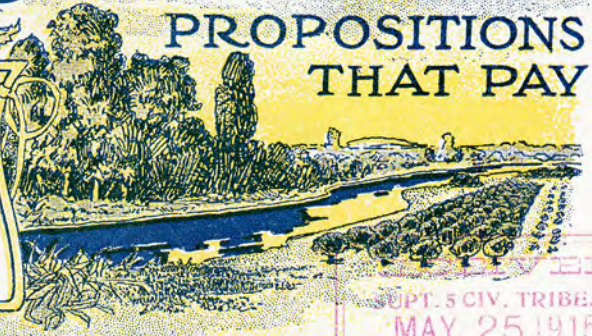

Dear Mr. Lynch:

There are enclosed herewith two rental contracts for grazing purposes, executed by Chickilla Fishinghawk in favor of F. W. C. Boesche, covering this allottee's land.

The records in this office show that the allottee is a full blood Cherokee, enrolled opposite No. 19269, and that the enrollment records show him to be twenty years of age. The records also show that Mr. J. L. Morton of Stillwell, Oklahoma, is guardian for this minor and that the case is pending in Adair County.

It appears that Mr. F. A. Blanck of Stillwell is acting as agent for this lessee, and has been instrumental in securing these contracts. The correspondence in the case, written by Mr. Blanck indicates that the guardian has been receiving only \$26.40 per year for the land, while these contracts provide for a rental of \$40.00 per year.

I would respectfully suggest, since this is, of course, void, as it is executed for a period of five years, which is in contravention of the act of Congress approved May 27, 1908 authorizing restricted allottees to lease their homestead land for a period of one year only without the approval of the Secretary of the Interior. In fact, it is believed that both leases are void, for the reason that the minor has no power to execute leases during minority and these leases have not been made by the guardian with the approval of the Court, as provided by law. They would therefore, only serve to cloud the title to the allottee's land if they are delivered and placed of record.

This matter was referred to this office by Mr. O. H. Lipps, Superintendent of the Carlisle Indian School, for investigation, so that he might be in a position to advise the minor whether or not the leases would be to his best interest.

The leases and correspondence are enclosed herewith, in order that you may have all the facts before you and see how far some of these parties go to cloud the title and otherwise tie up the allottee's land.

I would respectfully suggest, since this allottee becomes of age within the course of a year, you take this matter up with the guardian, with a view of having him lease the land for this year only. If it is found that it would be to the allottee's interest to lease the land after attaining his majority, the office will make investigation for the purpose of advising him fully in regard thereto.

Please return the correspondence and leases to this office with your report of the action taken, in order that Mr. Lippe may be advised as to the disposition of the case.

In reply you are advised the records of this office show two leases executed by J. L. Morton, guardian of Chickkill Fishinghawk, in favor of Thomas R. Dean and Waite Phillips, Royalty Nos. 10595 and 7131. Both leases, however, have been cancelled and the only money to the credit of same is the cancellation fee of \$1.00 on each lease, or \$2.00. The records of the other divisions fail to show any money to the credit of this minor.

At several different times vouchers have been prepared and forwarded to the guardian for the money on hand, but he has failed to have same signed and returned for payment.

I am today taking the matter up with the Field Clerk at Stilwell, Oklahoma, with the request that he communicate with Mr. Morton regarding this matter, and upon receipt of a report from him you will be further advised.

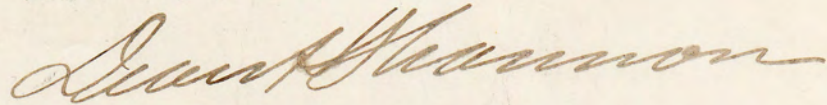
