My dear Sir:

If Martin Brave, who is named in your favor of the 26th instant, is the same Sioux boy who was enrolled at Carlisle by the name of Milton Brave) there is no objection to his enrolment at the Rapid City School on account of his conduct.

I have learned that when Milton came to Carlisle he was one of those untamed little fellows who had to be won over by the most careful effort. He deserted, was obstinate and generally hard to manage. However, a steady improvement in his conduct was shown and during the past year here he did very well. He was taught by our Band Master to blow a bugle and that seemed to be a great help in conquering himself.

If you cannot take Milton into the Rapid City School his return here is desired.

NOTE.—One of these blanks should be filled out by each pupil at Government boarding schools, preferably with the assistance of the superintendent or some one designated to act as his representative. If the superintendent is of opinion from the information given that the pupil is entitled to enrollment he should so indicate by signing the blank in the proper place and filing in the individual pupil's folder. In the case of pupils concerning whose eligibility or need of Government aid there is some doubt, superintendents should make proper remarks and recommendations in the space indicated and forward the form to the Indian Office for consideration.
