He has taken the reproof as an excuse to ask for permission to be released from this school and as the advice given him is not heeded he will be allowed to leave here on Wednesday evening of this week. A ticket for his use to Bemidji will be provided for him as it is his intention to come to your home at Red Lake.

It is to be regretted that Henry is taking such a stand as he has taken, but if he does not see the value of continuing with his school work here nothing can be gained by urging him further to remain here.

Please let me hear from you when Henry has arrived at your home.

Mr. Meyer:

In regard to the matter you brought up in the note hereto attached, I will say that I do not know of any trouble that Henry might have got into, excepting for what happened in this office a few days ago, which was not at all serious as I look at it. Last Tuesday night, Henry, in common with a lot of other boys, misbehaved himself in the auditorium when Fred Cardin and his associates were giving a Musical Recital. The next day, Henry, who was at that time assigned as one of the head care takers of this building, came into my office as usual and immediately upon his entering, I told him that I did not intend to have any boy in this school holding down a position of trust who did not know enough to behave himself in public, and I directed him at the same time to vacate this place in this office and to join the Sheet Metal Workers' detail where his services were sorely needed according to a statement from Mr. Bradley.

I do not know of any other complications regarding this boy.



Dear Sir:

I inclose for your information and that of Roland Roy, a pupil at your School, carbon copy of a letter of even date to one Ed Snetsinger, Duane, Minnesota,

I desire to inform you that our records show that Roland Roy who is allotted at this Agency under the name of Roland Henry Perrault, was born in November, 1894, and is listed as a person of  $\frac{3}{8}$  Indian blood. He therefore belongs to the class of Indians on this Reservation who were given authority by the Act of Congress of June 21, 1906, (34 Stat.L. 325 & 353) to handle their own allotments.

The lands allotted to Roland Henry Perrault under trust patent are as follows: Original allotment No 445, described as the Lot 11, Sec. 7, and SW $\frac{1}{4}$  of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ , Sec. 8-144-40, and Additional allotment No. 344, described as SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ , and SW $\frac{1}{4}$  of NE $\frac{1}{4}$ , Sec. 10-145-39. This information is given for the reason that I anticipate that the pupil will receive offers by mail for the sale of his lands or the sale of the timber on said lands, and any dealings which he has with his lands will be binding upon him the same as upon any other adult property owner.

For your information the records of this office show that this Indian is an adult of 3/8 Indian blood and under the provisions of the Act of June 21, 1906, (34 Stat. L. 325 & 353) this allottee is freed from the trusteeship of the United States.
