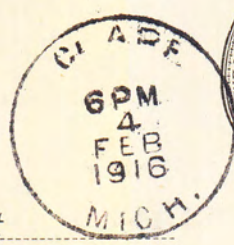

My dear Madam:

When your letter of the 5th instant was received here it was referred to our School Physician with a request that he submit a report in regard to your son and daughter and their cousin. Below you will find a copy of the statement that was addressed to me last evening:

"Lena Pelcher and Cecelia Pelcher are both in the hospital at this time. They had the Grippe, which in Lena's case was followed by neuralgia of the face and in Cecelia's case by a running ear. Neither girl is at all serious. There is no good reason for sending them home on account of health conditions."

A prior report had been submitted to me relative to the condition of William's health and it was recommended that his return home be effected. Arrangements are being made, therefore, to have him leave here on Monday afternoon of next week and at his request a ticket for his use to Rosebush will be procured for him.
