Superintendent.

My dear Sir:

Referring to the inquiry contained in your letter of the 21st instant, this is to advise you that recently Stella Red Star gave a ring to another girl at this school which had been stolen in the Spring from one of the employees' rooms. Stella evidently did not steal the ring in the first place, but she admitted that she picked it up in the school laundry one day from the ironing board in use by another girl and that she kept it in the bottom of her trunk all summer.

Although the fact cannot be overlooked that Stella got possession of the ring in an unusual manner, the fact that she did not steal it in the first place has been taken into consideration and it is believed that confessing her fault before all the girls is sufficient punishment. Nothing more will have to be done in the case.
