**SPECIAL NOTE.**

This form must be executed in duplicate when a child is transferred from a reservation to a non-reservation school. The Superintendent of the nonreservation school will retain the original for his files, and the duplicate shall be deposited in the Agency records. The agent will then send to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs his certificate as provided by law. All the blanks must be properly filled in every case.

*NOTE.*—Age limits, fourteen to twenty years. Preferably fourteen to eighteen. Students must be at least one-fourth Indian, preferably full Indian. Special cases beyond the age limit will be given consideration. An industrial course only can be taken and the term reduced to three years, in exceptional cases.



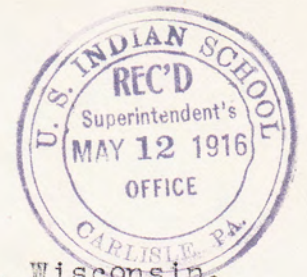

Replying to your letter of the 10th instant relative to requests that have been made by the parents of Edwin Greengrass and William Hall that their sons be allowed to return home this summer, this is to advise that arrangements have been completed for Edwin's going home and that a sufficient amount to pay for his transportation has been deposited here.

William Hall is taking a special course of work in the Ford Motor Company's factory in Detroit, Michigan, and if he will have any time at all to visit his parents it will be for a two week period in July or August when the annual inventory in the Ford factory is taken. Under no circumstances should William remain at home longer than during that period if it is arranged for him to visit his parents.

Trusting the action taken in Edwin's case meets with your approval and that later I can cooperate to arrange for William's visit if he has the required funds to pay for his
