SPECIAL NOTE.

This form must be executed in duplicate when a child is transferred from a reservation to a non-reservation school. The Superintendent of the nonreservation school will retain the original for his files, and the duplicate shall be deposited in the Agency records. The agent will then send to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs his certificate as provided by law. All the blanks must be properly filled in every case.

NOTE.—Age limits, fourteen to twenty years. Preferably fourteen to eighteen. Students must be at least one-fourth Indian, preferably full Indian. Special cases beyond the age limit will be given consideration. An industrial course only can be taken and the term reduced to three years, in exceptional cases.

INDORSEMENTS.

The laws relating to the transfer of Indian children from reservations and schools are as follows:

That hereafter no Indian child shall be sent from any Indian reservation to a school beyond the State or Territory in which said reservation is situated without the voluntary consent of the father or mother of such child if either of them is living, and if neither of them is living without the voluntary consent of the next of kin of such child. Such consent shall be made before the agent of the reservation, and he shall send to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs his certificate that such consent has been voluntarily given before such child shall be removed from such reservation. And it shall be unlawful for any Indian agent or other employee of the Government to induce, or seek to induce, by withholding rations or by other improper means, the parents or next of kin of any Indian to consent to the removal of any Indian child beyond the limits of any reservation. (28 Stats., p. 906.)

Provided, that hereafter no Indian child shall be taken from any school in any State or Territory to a school in any other State against its will or without the written consent of its parents. (29 Stats., p. 348.)

The rules provide that—

A pupil who has been regularly enrolled in a nonreservation school must not be taken to any other nonreservation school without the consent of both Superintendents and the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, and Superintendents will be held to strict accountability for such pupils taken to their schools.

An Indian boy or girl 18 years old and over may, without the consent of parents or others, personally sign the application form on its being changed to suit the case.

This form is to be used only in transfers from reservations, or Indian schools, to nonreservation schools.

Dear Mr. Wyly:

When Evaline Foreman was seen at this office in compliance with the suggestion contained in your letter of the 15th instant that she be given an opportunity to state just when she could reimburse the Government for the amount that has been expended to bring her to Carlisle she informed me that she has to depend on her rents and that the next installment is due about the first of the next year. In view of the fact, therefore, that she is expecting money it probably can be arranged to pay for her transportation with the understanding that a reimbursement will be effected when she has funds of her own that may be used for such a purpose.

My dear Mr. Lipps:

I have your letter of the 12th instant, advising that you have a letter from the Pittsburg office of the Missouri, Kansas and Texas lines to the effect that Evaline Foreman was provided with a ticket to Carlisle, and requesting that authorization be given to have the ticket charged to the account of the school. I also note what you have to say with reference to Miss Foreman in your letter of August 31.

At the time the party of new and re-enrolled pupils were leaving Muskogee for Carlisle Miss Foreman came to the office and stated that while she had no funds to pay for transportation and incidental expenses enroute that if a ticket were furnished her she would reimburse the school later or when her rents were received from her farm. I am personally acquainted with Miss Foreman's family and I know that they are not financially able to bear this expense, and

inasmuch as none of the other 23 pupils were going to your school at Government expense it was decided to ask for transportation for Miss Foreman.

I will be pleased to have you take this matter up with her and ascertain just when she will reimburse you for the ticket, and I will also thank you to advise me further in the matter.
