SPECIAL NOTE.

School Physician.

This form must be executed in duplicate when a child is transferred from a reservation to a nonreservation school. The Superintendent of the nonreservation school will retain the original for his files, and the duplicate shall be deposited in the reservation school records. The reservation superintendent should send to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs his certificate as provided by law. All the blanks must be properly filled in every case.

If the information called for on any part of the blank is not known, that fact should be stated. No space should be left unfilled. Whether the parents are living or dead, their names must be given.

The person who signs the blank as consenting to the transfer should indicate his relation to the applicant by marling out the word "parent," "guardian," or "next of kin," leaving unmarked only the title appropriate to the signer.

INDORSEMENTS.

The laws relating to the transfer of Indian children from reservations and schools are as follows:

That hereafter no Indian child shall be sent from any Indian reservation to a school beyond the State or Territory in which said reservation is situated without the voluntary consent of the father or mother of such child if either of them are living, and if neither of them are living without the voluntary consent of the next of kin of such child. Such consent shall be made before the agent of the reservation, and he shall send to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs his certificate that such consent has been voluntarily given before such child shall be removed from such reservation. And it shall be unlawful for any Indian agent or other employee of the Government to induce, or seek to induce, by withholding rations or by other improper means, the parents or next of kin of any Indian to consent to the removal of any Indian child beyond the limits of any reservation. (28 Stats., p. 906.)

Provided, That hereafter no Indian child shall be taken from any school in any State or Territory to a school in any other State against its will or without the written consent of its parents. (29 Stats.,

p. 348.)

That no Indian pupil under the age of fourteen years shall be transported at Government expense to any Indian school beyond the limits of the State or Territory in which the parents of such child reside or of the adjoining State or Territory. (35 Stat. L., 781.)

The rules provide that-

A pupil who has been regularly enrolled in a nonreservation school must not be taken to any other nonreservation school without the consent of both Superintendents and the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, and superintendents will be held to strict accountability for such pupils taken to their schools.

An Indian boy or girl 18 years old and over may, without the consent of parents or others, personally sign the application form on its being changed to suit the case; but in all cases where the parents are living they should first be consulted.

This form is to be used only in transfers from reservations or Indian schools to nonreservation schools.

"In regard to Martha Waters, I submit the following report: Martha Waters is living with Mrs. Alfred Wagg, Collingswood, N. J. I visited her on
Wednesday, June 10th and find she is very happy
and contented in her home. Her eyes do not seem
to be giving her any trouble-at all. She tells me
she likes her home very much and is learning many
things and looks much better than when she came out.

The family consists of Rev. and Mrs. Wagg, a little son nine years of age, and a daughter just home from Dickinson College. Rev. Wagg is paster of the Methodist Church located next door to the parsonage, so the home is in a delightful location. The work is not heavy, in fact, quite light. All the washing is sent out including Martha's - ironing is done at the home - all working together.

As to her being left alone - she has never been left alone at night. During the past week special services were held in the church next door and which Mr. and Mrs. Wagg attended. Martha, at her own desire, preferred to remain at home with the little boy. She has the privilege of attending always. She is a part of the family, has her place at the table with the family, sits on the porch with them in the even-

ings. The evenings she remained at home were spent in the dining room writing letters and reading. The

services were over in about two hours.

Mrs. Wagg says Martha wrote numerous letters on the Sunday following her arrival on the previous Friday. She asked permission to remain from Sunday School. Doubtless, at that time she was strange and new in the home and expressed her lonesomeness in her letters. She says her eyes bothered her the first day due to the wind and dust from traveling.


