Your letter in regard to your son, Frank Logan, has been received. I am sorry to tell you that Frank did desert from the school and was gone several days. He was arrested at Mifflin, Pa., for trespassing and illegal train riding. I send an officer for him to the Mifflin jail and had him brought back to school. He will not be punished for he now sees his mistake and apologized before the boys. I doubt if he will ever repeat this offence; it certainly was a dangerous thing to do. I think he did not have any trouble in the quarters, where he now is, but the desire came over him to wander which he did, but the cost of this wandering amounted to \$7.58. I will appreciate it very much if you can send me this amount to settle this indebtedness against him.
