### READ THE LAW

"Any person having so conveyed any personal property who shall, during the existence of such title or lien, sell, transfer, conceal, take, drive or carry away, or in any manner dispose of such property or any part thereof, or cause or suffer the same to be done without the written consent of the ho'der of such incumbrance, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction may be fined in a sum not exceeding twice the value of the property so sold or disposed of, or confined in the county jail not exceeding one year, or both, at the discretion of the court." Chap. 95, Par. 7582 Sec. 7 Ill. Statute.

### U. S. MAIL LAWS
