





I have your letter saying that yourdaughter Madeline has written you again complaining about her eyes.

I have had her examined by our doctor again and he recommends that she be sent to Dr. Fox, of Philadelphia, for examination. He thinks that Madeline is exaggerating her condition, but to clear all doubt I can send her to this expert and have his opinion. If he finds it necessary to operate he will do so without further conferring with us, and without any charge for the operation. Madeline, however, will have to have money to pay her expenses to Philadelphia and return, and also enough to pay her board at the hospital until she is able to return to Carlisle. She has to her account only \$8.20, which is not enough to pay her expenses for this trip. If you will send me a check for \$15.00 I think this will be sufficient to cover all her expenses with what she has here.

I might add that Dr. Fox is an eye expert who has taken care of our Indian children for many years, and we have

full confidence in his ability. He is especially kind and considerate of the Indian children and I know he will do the best he can for your daughter.

If you are in need of this money, or any part thereof, for the improvement of your allotment, purchase of live stock, farming implements, or other necessaries, you should take the matter up with your local field clerk for investigation and recommendation.

Please do not come to the Muskogee office for this money, as payments can only be made upon the recommendation of the field clerks, and all checks will be sent by mail to the field clerk recommending the payment.

She took this advice and was sent to Philadelphia last Monday February 12th and is still there in the hospital, undergoing treatment. I did this because Dr. Rendtorff who had been examining and treating her eyes, has left us, and our present physician does not treat eyes. When I get a report from Dr. Fox, relative to Madeline's eyes, I will send you a copy. It is reported to me by the instructors here that this girl exaggerates her eye trouble and that she does not take care of her eyes. She refuses to wear her glasses when she is at work and does not take good care of the glasses.
