Louis Kanard, a Creek Indian boy enrolled at your school, has written me relative to returning home to spend the summer vacation. His letter was sent to the Field Clerk at Okmulgee and he was requested to take the matter up with the boy's guardian, a Mr. Morton.

I have a letter from the Field Clerk in which he says that the guardian states Louis is of age, although he has not been discharged, and he really has no authority to dictate as to whether he should come home or not, but in a letter some time ago to the boy he advised him to remain at Carlisle until his term was out or until he had completed the course of study. He also says that Louis has two sisters there and if he were to come home the girls would no doubt want to come also and this would mean a great deal of extra expense, and he seems to think that if Louis is influenced to stay at Carlisle he will do so.

I sould thank you to take this up with Louis and this his that it would be to his best interest to stay at Carlisle until the expiration of his term or until he had finished his trade. The guardian seems to think that Louis is a sincere boy and is interested in his school work, but he is apprehensive that influences at home might persuade him not to return to school.

TO OIL AND GAS LESSEES OR ASSIGNEES:

Section 39 a of the regulations of April 20, 100, provides as follows:

"No lease or any interest therein by working or drilling contract or otherwise, or the use of such lease, shall be sublet, assigned or transferred, directly or indirectly, without the consent of the Secretary of the Interior: and if at any time the Secretary of the Interior is satisfied that the provisions of any lease, or that any of the regulations hereto fore or that may be hereafter prescribed have been violated, he reserves authority to terminate the lease in the manner therein provided, and the lessor shall then be entitled to take immediate possession of the land,"

A similar provision is contained in all Departmental oil and gas mining leases, and as there seems to be a growing tendency on the part of prospective lease owners to immediately take possession of a lease for the purpose of be-Ginning operations immediately after the execution of an assignment and before Departmental approval thereof, proposed assignees are cautioned in all cases to hear in mind that this action is a clear violation of the terms of the lease and the regulations of the Department to which it is subject.

In some cases which have heretofore been brought to the attention of this office, prospective owners of leases have submitted various reasons, including unfamiliarity with the regulations. necessity for early operations, etc., and have asked, notwithstanding their violation of the terms of the lease, that the assignment be approved and the title thereby perfected.

Further complications arise where proposed assignees pay the holder of the lease the consideration agreed upon prior to the approval of the assignment. The lesses, in many cases, has declined to take any further interest in the matter, or furnish reports or papers required by the Department to place the assignment in proper shape for approval.

In all cases where the land involved should be operated immediately, or where the prospective lease owner desires to operate the premises at an early date, upon receipt of notice to that effect, I shall be glad to give such cases early and especial attention, to the end that such assignments may be approved with the least possible delay, but proposed assignees should in no case attempt to take possession of the land until the assignment of lease covering the same has been approved.

Furthermore, under the express terms of the loases themselves, I see no other alternative, if this practice is repeated, than to make an adverse recommendation on the assignment, and such violation of the lease contracts will also make the leases themselves subject to cancellation.

In other words, purchasers of leases should not pay for ner take possession under an assignment until the case has been acted upon and approved by the Department. Louis Harand
