INDORSEMENTS.

The laws relating to the transfer of Indian children from reservations and schools are as follows:

That hereafter no Indian child shall be sent from any Indian reservation to a school beyond the State or Territory in which said reservation is situated without the voluntary consent of the father or mother of such child if either of them are living, and if neither of them are living without the voluntary consent of the next of kin of such child. Such consent shall be made before the agent of the reservation, and he shall send to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs his certificate that such consent has been voluntarily given before such child shall be removed from such reservation. And it shall be unlawful for any Indian agent or other employee of the Government to induce, or seek to induce, by withholding rations or by other improper means, the parents or next of kin of any Indian to consent to the removal of any Indian child beyond the limits of any reservation. (28 Stats., p. 906.)

Provided, That hereafter no Indian child shall be taken from any school in any State or Territory to a school in any other State against its will or without the written consent of its parents. (29 Stats., p. 348.)

That no Indian pupil under the age of fourteen years shall be transported at Government expense to any Indian school beyond the limits of the State or Territory in which the parents of such child reside or of the adjoining State or Territory. (35 Stat. L., 781.)

The rules provide that—

A pupil who has been regularly enrolled in a nonreservation school must not be taken to any other nonreservation school without the consent of both superintendents and the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, and superintendents will be held to strict accountability for such pupils taken to their schools.

An Indian boy or girl 18 years old and over may, without the consent of parents or others, personally sign the application form on its being changed to suit the case but in all cases where the parents are living they should first be consulted.

This form is to be used only in transfers from reservations or Indian schools to nonreservation schools.

I am in receipt of your letter of recent date enclosing one from Mrs. Lillie Blake, whose son Robert is a pupil of this school.

You can tell Mrs. Blake that we had a case of small pox at the school but the boy who had it is very nearly well now. The school was under quarantine for several days but this was lifted yesterday.

The hospital which is some distance away from the buildings where the pupils live, is still under strict quarantine. All pupils and employees who have not been vaccinated with the last five or seven years, were vaccinated, unless they showed a good mark on the arm.

You can assure Mrs. Blake that every precaution has been taken to prevent the spread of the disease and that at present Robert is in good health. I enclose her letter to you.

We, the undersigned, respectfully request that leave of absence be granted town.

returned to the Carlisle Indian school on or before the last day of the leave of absence.
We further agree to deposit with the superintendent of the school sufficient money to defray all expenses
to be incurred, and should the pupils, or any one of them, fail to return to school at such time as may
be agreed upon by the parents or guardian and the superintendent of the school in which the pupils
are enrolled, the amount of money remaining with the superintendent, necessary to the return trans-
portation of the pupil or pupils so neglecting to return, shall be forfeited to the Government; provided,
however, that in all cases where it can be shown that there were justifiable reasons for the failure of the

If the pupil neglecting to return is from a reservation, the superintendent of the reservation shall certify to the reasons for the nonreturn of the pupil or pupils. If a pupil's home is not on a reservation, then the certificate of some reputable, disinterested citizen of the community may be requested as to the reasons for the nonreturn of the pupil or pupils.

Referring to Robert Blake, a quarter-blood Choctaw Indian boy enrolled at your school, three or four attempts have been made to have Mrs. Lillie Blake, the boy's mother, complete an eligibility blank but she has refused to do so. She says that she wants Robert released so that he may return home and attend school there.

Under the circumstances I presume there is nothing further to do in this case and I therefore recommend that he be permitted to come home. If the school has advanced any funds to pay transportation for him or for any other purpose his parents should be required to reimburse

If their parents want them to remain here until the end of the present school year and are willing to pay tuition for them at the rate of \$200 a year, for the actual time they have attended school here, I will be glad to ask the Office for authority to retain them until the time named.
