INDORSEMENTS.

The laws relating to the transfer of Indian children from reservations and schools are as follows:

That hereafter no Indian child shall be sent from any Indian reservation to a school beyond the State or Territory in which said reservation is situated without the voluntary consent of the father or mother of such child if either of them is living, and if neither of them is living without the voluntary consent of the next of kin of such child. Such consent shall be made before the agent of the reservations, and he shall send to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs his certificate that such consent has been voluntarily given before such child shall be removed from such reservation. And it shall be unlawful for any Indian agent or other employee of the Government to induce, or seek to induce, by withholding rations or by other improper means, the parents or next of kin of any Indian to consent to the removal of any Indian child beyond the limits of any reservations. (28 Stats., p. 906.)

Provided, That hereafter no Indian child shall be taken from any school in any State or Territory to a school in any other State against its will or without the written consent of its parents. (29 Stats., p. 348.)

The rules provide that-

A pupil who has been regularly enrolled in a nonreservations school must not be taken to any other nonreservation school without the consent of both Superintendents and the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, and Superintendents will be held to strict accountability for such pupils taken to their schools.

An Indian boy or girl 18 years old and over may, without the consent of parents or others, personally sign the application form on its being changed to suit the case.

This form is to be used only in transfers from reservations, or Indian schools, to nonreservation schools.



I am sorry to inform you so soon after giving you a good report about your grand daughter. Charlette, that the school dector new reports very unfavorably regarding her. She has developed glandular enlargements on the neek and has other symptoms pointing strongly to tuberculesia. She is in the hospital new under regular treatment and the dector says that semething else must be done for her at once.

Now I can arrange to send her to a sanatorium for the treatment of tuberculosis cases, if you will permit me to do this. It is possible I may be able to get her in at the one located at Toledo, Iowa. She will not be so far away from her home then.

If you prefer to have her at home, it will be necessary to send more money to pay fornher ticket. A ticket from Carlisle to Bemidji will cost about \$36.13. She has not spent any of the \$25 which you sent her a few weeks ago.

I would urge however that you let me arrange to send Charlotte to a sanatorium. We have a chance of saving her life by doing this and I hope you will give your permission. Please let me hear from you at once.





If it should be found desirable to change the plans for Miss Caswell's trip, and you will telegraph me, I will arrange accordingly.




