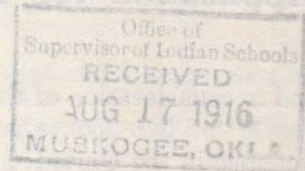

This is also to advise you that the homes to which our "Outing" students are allowed to go are all carefully selected and that they are regularly visited by the Boys' or the Girls' Outing Agent so that any conditions that need correcting are adjusted or else the boy or girl at such a home is taken away.
