## SPECIAL NOTE.

This form must be executed in duplicate when a child is transferred from a reservation to a nonreservation school. The Superintendent of the nonreservation school will retain the original for his files, and the duplicate shall be deposited in the reservation school records. The reservation superintendent should send to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs his certificate as provided by law. All the blanks must be properly filled in every case.

If the information called for on any part of the blank is not known, that fact should be stated. No space should be left unfilled. Whether the parents are living or dead, their names must be given.

The person who signs the blank as consenting to the transfer should indicate his relation to the applicant by marking out the word "parent," "guardian," or "next of kin," leaving unmarked only the title appropriate to the signer. 6-87e

## INDORSEMENTS.

The laws relating to the transfer of Indian children from reservations and schools are as follows:
That hereafter no Indian child shall be sent from any Indian reservation to a school beyond the State or Territory in which said reservation is situated without the voluntary consent of the father or mother of such child if either of them are living, and if neither of them are living without the voluntary consent of the next of kin of such child. Such consent shall be made before the agent of the reservation, and he shall send to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs his certificate that such consent has been voluntarily given before such child shall be removed from such reservation. And it shall be unlawful for any Indian agent or other employee of the Government to induce, or seek to induce, by withholding rations or by other improper means, the parents or next of kin of any Indian to consent to the removal of any Indian child beyond the limits of any reservation. (28 Stats., p. 906.)

Provided, That hereafter no Indian child shall be taken from any school in any State or Territory to a school in any other State against its will or without the written consent of its parents. (29 Stats., p. 348.)

That no Indian pupil under the age of fourteen years shall be transported at Government expense to any Indian school beyond the limits of the State or Territory in which the parents of such child reside or of the adjoining State or Territory. (35 Stat. L., 781.)

The rules provide that-
A pupil who has been regularly enrolled in a nonreservation school must not be taken to any other nonreservation school without the consent of both superintendents and the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, and superintendents will be held to strict accountability for such pupils taken to their schools.

An Indian boy or girl 18 years old and over may, without the consent of parents or others, personally sign the application form on its being changed to suit the case but in all cases where the parents are living they should first be consulted.

This form is to be used only in transfers from reservations or Indian schools to nonreservation schools.

Dear Mr. Francis:
There is enclosed herewith the approved application for the enrollment of Virgil Jackson, [a $3 / 4$ blood Choctaw Indian girl 16 years of age. A blank to test eligibility is also enclosed.

Virgil has attended a number of schools, including Wheelock Academy, an Indian school for Choctaw girls. The matter of her enrollment at Carlisle was taken up with the Superintendent there and she recommended her transfer. It is reported Virgil's home conditions and surroundings are not good and her mother is very desirous that she attend a school that will take her entirely away from her present environment.
Virgil went to Carlisle with the pupils who left
here about Sept. 1.

On account of recent death of maternal grand-mother of the said Virginia Jackson, ward of writer and pupil of your institution, the undersigned would respectfully show that it is necessary that Virginia be granted leave of absence from your institution for a short while for the peas on that her grand-mother's receit death makes it so hard for her mother that she desires the presence and association of Virginia in her home; and for the further reason that Virginia is needed here in matters pending in the Probate Court in which she is pecuniarily interested, and her presence is necessary for the proper adjustment of same, she being more than twelve years of age.

For the above reason the undersigned $r$ respectfully asks that you grant her a leave of absence until the time for the opening of the fall term of school. And, if you think it advisable I will have her enter and attend the State Normal during the summer, and suggest that you suggest the studios she had best pursue if she enters said normal school.

I have today wired Virginia $\$ 100.00$; guess I should have sent it to you but did not. Please see that same is judiciously expended.
