when your letter of the 22nd ultimo was received here your son Louis was called to this office in order that he could explain further regarding the complaint he made to you about the work he is doing here. It was learned that he was given permission to go out with other boys on Saturdays during late October and in Movember to husk corn for neighboring farmers, a practice that is usually allowed at Carlisle each year to afford boys who want to do so an opportunity to earn extra spending money. It was also learned that he has been at work on our school farms and the statement that was submitted by our Disciplinarian after he too had talked to your son is as follows:
