Dear Mr. Francis:

Earnest Anderson, Creek Indian boy about 18 years of age, enrolled at Carlisle in September 1915 and deserted after staying there only four or five months, came in the office today to see me about returning, and I told him I would write you about his case.

I seriously doubt whether it would be much use to enroll him again as he has been out of school practically two years and seemingly has little ambition and little interest. He is a member of the restricted class, being one-half Indian blood. He did not remember the grade he was in or the exact date of his leaving Carlisle. He came in with Lyman Bruner who is at home on leave and due to return to Carlisle in about ten days, and desires to go back to the school with Lyman. I suggest that you look up his record and if you think it advisable you might give him shother trial; however, I doubt the advisability of it.

# VACATION REQUEST FOR PUPIL.

We, the undersigned, respectfully request that leave of absence be granted
fromJune 1st, 1918 to Beginning of fall term to
enablehim to visithis home. We hereby agree to pay all expenses, including
round-trip railroad fares, sleeping-car fares, meals, lodging, stage fares, telegraph and telephone messages,
and other incidental expenses connected with the visit. We further agree that said pupil shall be
returned to theCarlisle school on or before the last day of the leave of absence.
We further agree to deposit with the superintendent of the school sufficient money to defray all expenses
to be incurred, and should the pupils, or any one of them, fail to return to school at such time as may
be agreed upon by the parents or guardian and the superintendent of the school in which the pupils
are enrolled, the amount of money remaining with the superintendent, necessary to the return trans-
portation of the pupil or pupils so neglecting to return, shall be forfeited to the Government; provided,
however, that in all cases where it can be shown that there were justifiable reasons for the failure of the
return of the pupil the forfeiture of the funds shall not take place.
