Application for Enrollment in a Nonreservation School.

For and in consideration of the United States assuming the care, education, and maintenance in the United States Indian School at Carlisle Pa, of Hazel L. Plummer, girl, I, Clarissa Plummer of Salamanca P. O., State of New York, do hereby voluntarily consent and agree to her enrollment in said school for a period of three years, and also obligate and bind myself to abide by all the rules and regulations for Indian schools.

I further say that the said child was born at Salamanca N.Y. on May 30, 1903; that the father, Lewis Plummer, was a Full Indian of the Seneca Tribe located at Salamanca N.Y. Agency; that he left the tribe about March 1st 1917; that the mother, Clarissa Plummer, is a Half Indian of the Seneca Tribe located at Salamanca N.Y. Agency, and left the tribe about _____; that the said child was born and reared in the United States, and now actually resides therein; and that he has attended the following schools:

INDORSEMENT.

A child showing one-sixteenth or less Indian blood, whose parents live on an Indian reservation, Indian fashion, who, if debarred from the Government schools, could not obtain an education, may be permitted in the reservation day and boarding schools, but it is preferable that it be not transferred to a nonreservation school, without permission from the Office. Children showing one-eighth or less Indian blood, whose parents do not live on an Indian reservation, whose home is among white people where there are churches and schools, who are presumed to have adopted the white man's manners and customs, and are to all intents and purposes white people, are debarred from enrollment in the Government nonreservation and reservation schools. Superintendents, in all cases where doubt exists as to the degree of Indian blood of a child proposed for transfer, should fully satisfy themselves of the facts by affidavits from reliable persons, which affidavits must be kept on file at the school.

A pupil who has been regularly enrolled in a nonreservation school must not be taken to any other nonreservation school without the consent of both Superintendents and the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, and Superintendents will be held to strict accountability for such pupils taken to their schools.

A pupil dismissed from school for cause must not be enrolled in any other school without the permission of the Commissioner of Indian Affairs. Full facts must be submitted with each request.

INFORMATION REQUIRED UNDER DECLARATION OF POLICY

Elimination of Ineligible Pupils from the Government Indian Schools.—In many of our boarding schools Indian children are being educated at Government expense whose parents are amply able to pay for their education and have public school facilities at or near their homes. Such children shall not hereafter be enrolled in Government Indian schools supported by gratuity appropriations, except on payment of actual per capita cost and transportation.

INFORMATION REQUIRED UNDER DECLARATION OF POLICY

Information of eligible pupils from the Government Indian schools - In order to be eligible school Indian children are first placed in Government Indian schools, and then are to pay for their education and have other school facilities at or near their homes. Such children shall not thereafter be entitled to Government Indian school support if their parents, guardians, or payment of actual per capita cost and transportation.
