SPECIAL NOTE.

This form must be executed in duplicate when a child is transferred from a reservation to a nonreservation school. The Superintendent of the nonreservation school will retain the original for his files, and the duplicate shall be deposited in the reservation school records. The reservation superintendent should send to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs his certificate as provided by law. All the blanks must be properly filled in every case.

If the information called for on any part of the blank is not known, that fact should be stated. No space should be left unfilled. Whether the parents are living or dead, their names must be given.

The person who signs the blank as consenting to the transfer should indicate his relation to the applicant by marking out the word "parent," "guardian," or "next of kin," leaving unmarked only the title appropriate to the signer.

## INDORSEMENTS.

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The laws relating to the transfer of Indian children from reservations and schools are as follows:

That hereafter no Indian child shall be sent from any Indian reservation to a school beyond the State or Territory in which said reservation is situated without the voluntary consent of the father or mother of such child if either of them are living, and if neither of them are living without the voluntary consent of the next of kin of such child. Such consent shall be made before the agent of the reservation, and he shall send to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs his certificate that such consent has been voluntarily given before such child shall be removed from such reservation. And it shall be unlawful for any Indian agent or other employee of the Government to induce, or seek to induce, by withholding rations or by other improper means, the parents or next of kin of any Indian to consent to the removal of any Indian child beyond the limits of any reservation. (28 Stats., p. 906.)

*Provided*, That hereafter no Indian child shall be taken from any school in any State or Territory to a school in any other State against its will or without the written consent of its parents. (29 Stats., p. 348.)

That no Indian pupil under the age of fourteen years shall be transported at Government expense to any Indian school beyond the limits of the State or Territory in which the parents of such child reside or of the adjoining State or Territory. (35 Stat. L., 781.)

The rules provide that—

A pupil who has been regularly enrolled in a nonreservation school must not be taken to any other nonreservation school without the consent of both superintendents and the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, and superintendents will be held to strict accountability for such pupils taken to their schools.

An Indian boy or girl 18 years old and over may, without the consent of parents or others, personally sign the application form on its being changed to suit the case but in all cases where the parents are living they should first be consulted.

This form is to be used only in transfers from reservations or Indian schools to nonreservation schools.

Dear Mr. Francis:

Referring to your letter of Jan. 22, enclosing a summons served by the Sheriff of Cumberland County, Pa., on Alfred Pike, a Choctaw boy enrolled at your school, notifying him of a suit brought by Ed F. Johns, et al., against Alfred Pike and others, I referred this matter to the Acting Field Clerk at Chickasha, the county seat of Grady County, and asked him to investigate and report whether it was necessary for Alfred Pike to appear in Court on the date mentioned in the summons. He answered by enclosing a copy of the petition filed and I immediately took the matter up with G. W. Dukes, the legal guardian of Alfred, and asked him to advise me in the matter.

I have just received a letter from J.H. Cruthis, of Talihina, Oklahoma, the attorney for the guardian, in which this statement occurs:

"This is a matter that will not necessitate the boy returning home and a guardian ad litem will be appointed and general denial filed. The facts are, this boy's interest was sold for \$2900 many years ago and duly approved by the County Court and the funds accounted for.

I am sending a petition to Alfred through the office for appointment for a guardian ad litem that he can sign at Carlisle. We therefore see no necessity whatsoever of having the lad return and of course a judgment would not go by default against him but that will be guarded".

In view of the attorney's statements it will not be necessary for Alfred to come home for the trial, and when the petition is received for the appointment of a guardian ad litem, I would thank you to have Alfred sign it and return it immediately.

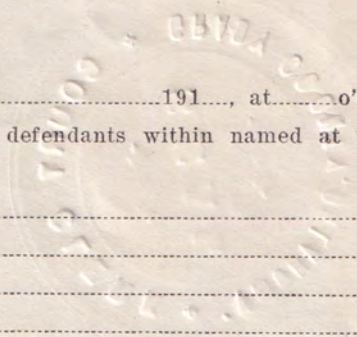
