Dear Madam:

I have your request that your daughters be sent to you and will arrange to send them Tuesday, July 30th. You can meet them at DePere on Wednesday, on the train due there about 3:00 o'clock. As I am paying their transportation from Government funds, it will not be necessary for you to send any money.

I am sorry to inform you that Vera overstepped our rules the other evening during the time the pupils were having a lawn social. She went to a forbidden part of the grounds with one of the boys and was with him for quite a while. We have had to watch Vera very closely during the whole time she has been at Carlisle, and have never allowed her to go to an outing home after her first summer at Carlisle, and then because we felt we could not trust her with boys.

the matron.

She also said that if Vera
is sick or if she must come ^{home}
for her bad conduct she should
come to me.

and I shall both be very glad
to have Vera, at any time

I think I
will always
love her.

you think it best to send her -
we always got along good
with her.

We have heard from Vera, but
she has never had a word to
complain of her duties at school,
and it was always my advise
to her to do right and stick.

of Vera's, nevertheless I shall
give her the benefit of the
doubt till I hear from you.

Please do not let the girls
know that I wrote in regards
to the above, but beg you to

It was in 1903 that I finished barlisk and I am quite sure no one would like a visit to the school any better than I would.
