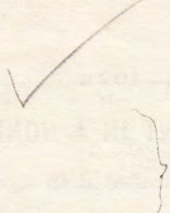

If the information called for on any part of the blank is not known, that fact should be stated. No space should be left unfilled. Whether the parents are living or dead, their names must be given.

The person who signs the blank as consenting to the transfer should indicate his relation to the applicant by marking out the word "parent," "guardian," or "next of kin," leaving unmarked only the title appropriate to the signer.

The enrollment of Indian pupils in nonreservation schools is governed by the "Rules for the Indian Service, 1913," sections 12, 13, 14, 15, 18, 19, 36, 112, 113, 114, 117, 118, 124 (b).

I have your invitation for Louisa Kanard to spend a part of the Christmas holidays with her sister Judy and have to say that I know of nothing to prevent this visit if Louisa has sufficient funds. She has no money in bank now and unless she can get some from her home before now and Christmas, she will not be able to accept your invitation. We continue school during the holidays so she will have to make her visit brief, possibly from Saturday morning until Tuesday evening.

Dear Sir:

I am enclosing you Oil and Gas Mining Lease covering the allotment of Louisa Kanard, or at lease eighty acres of same. If she desires to make this lease, Mr. French will give her as bonus Two Hundred Dollars. If she will execute same before you and you will return this lease to the Indian Agent, at Muskogee, I will deposit the Two Hundred Dollars with him to be sent to Louisa Karnard. For your information, will say that there is an Oil Inspector connected with the Agency at Muskogee, and should he think the bonus offered was too little, he will require us to pay any additional money before the lease would be approved. In the event we did not meet his appraisalment, we would lose the Two Hundred Dollars already paid as original bonus.

If she decides to make this lease and you will have notary take acknowledgements and mail me amount I will remit to cover. Please mail the lease to Gabe E. Parker, at Muskogee, and notify me and I will remit the Bonus money. *to Mr. Parker.*
