Both boys come from good families and I trust will make good. Wakeman has a brother who is a Presbyterian missionary on the Pine Ridge reservation. Jones' father was a lay reader in the Episcopal church at this place for a good many years. The boys attended school here for some time but dropped out during Dr. Michael's regime and have not been in school since that time. It is probable that they cannot do fifth grade work at first, but will have to review for a while.



He has written his people here asking them to send him \$40.00 to pay for his transportation. I do not understand just where he is to entrain, whether at Carlisle or at his home here at Flandreau. However, his grandmother is very old now and one of his brothers is in very poor health and is very doubtful whether he will ever see them again should he go into the army and if it is possible for you to pay his transportation here in order that he might come home for a short time I would recommend that such action be taken.
