His father, Andy Little, who recently died in this county was a member of the Mescalero Apache tribe and under the jurisdiction of the agent at the Mescalero Reservation in this county.

Andy Little gave my client a mortgage on some land in this county, and this is a suit to foreclose the mortgage. It is necessary to make all the heirs of Andy Little parties to the suit for under our law they all have an interest as heirs in the land. Summons has been served on all the defendants including two of the children who are attending school at Mescalero in this county.

Kindly have some person over the age of 21 hand the inclosed copy of summons personally to Luis and then have such person go before a notary public and sign and swear to the affidavit you will find attached to the original summons.

I am inclosing check \$1.50 for the services in this matter.

As this case has been pending sometime I will ask that you give the matter your prompt attention and I thank you in anticipation of this courtesy.

Of course the original summons should be returned to me after the affidavit has been filled out, signed and sworn to.


