I hope, however, that Simon will not despair and that he will make further efforts to build up his weakened body. I am also sorry to know that your little son, my namesake, has not been well. I hope he will show continued improvement and that he will grow up into a fine large boy. I extend my very best wishes for the little fellow.

I had heard about your daughter's difficulty in

connection with her detail to the school laundry. I have also investigated the matter and have given instructions for those in charge of the girls to be patient with her.
