I have not undertaken any special line of work for these people as those of my age all know their own business, and those of the older generation are doing fairly well, and as all elderly people have their set ways, so have these. Therefore if I have been of any special benefit to the Onida tribe it has been by setting the example, "do your best in your own line of duty and be as good a citizen as possible".

a large number of our tribe have become citizens we have been voters for some years.

The Govt. does not do very much for us financially

considering what it does for other tribes. Therefore what we
own we work for and we work against odds too.

Our anxiety this year amounted to only 44 cts a piece.

We are to have a Harval Route this coming season, which
will speak of the progressiveness of the Oneidas.

I have not a picture of my family home but here is
one of the family. My wife is a Carlisle Student
and she is well posted for her people to help
and well advanced as I am.
