A QUESTION OF LAW.

Agent Frater of the Leech Lake Agency, differs with Henry Warren, superintendent of the Indian boarding school at Bena, regarding the rights of Chippewas on the forest reserve.

Recently an Indian, who lives in the vicinity of Bena, cut and stacked some hay within the limits of the forest reserve, but within the Chippewa reservation, on a meadow which he claims he, with much labor, cleared of brush and debris. This year the grass on the meadow was sold by Mr. Marshall, the forestry reserve superintendent at Cass Lake, to a white settler on the reservation.

When the latter went to the land he found the grass had been cut by the Indian and the former claimed it. The Indian resisted the claim and from this a dispute has arisen between Major Frater and Mr. Warren, the former taking the position that inasmuch as it is a forestry reservation Mr. Marshall has exclusive jurisdiction over it, while the latter insists that on account of certain conditions the Indians still have vested rights within the reservation, and from which they cannot be separated until the act of January 14, 1889, relative to the Chippewas of Minnesota has been fulfilled in every particular.

Technically Agent Frater may be right, altho from an Indian's point of view we do not believe he is.

Under the provisions of the act referred to, the United States practically transferred to the Chippewas of Minnesota all the Chippewa reservation occupied by them, not as a tribe but as individuals.

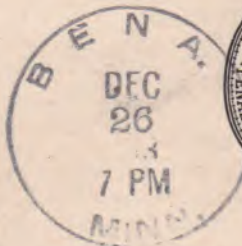
The conditions of this transfer were that the Indians would select allotments of land in severalty, and the residue to be classified as agricultural and pine land and sold for their benefit. It was further agreed that the United States would act as trustee to the Chippewas in the disposal of these surplus lands and timber.

From the date of the agreement in 1889, the government has violated it, and has conducted its trusteeship in a manner that would caused the arrest of an ordinary trustee appointed by a court had he done likewise. In the course of its trusteeship it has assumed to its own use and benefit nearly two hundred thousand acres of land with a large portion of the pine timber thereon, without even suggesting that it would compensate the Indian owners of the land.

It is a cardinal principal of the laws of this country that the property of a people cannot be confiscated even by legislation, and for this reason the Chippewas of Minnesota claim that until the act of 1889, is fulfilled in every respect, the lands which have not been sold under its provisions to actual settlers under the homestead laws, are still their property and can be used by them.

It would be to the interest of the Chippewas of Minnesota if they would employ attorneys if necessary to sustain the position assumed by Henry Warren, who is himself a member of the tribe and therefore personally interested in the result.
