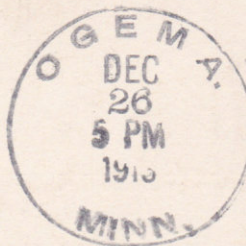

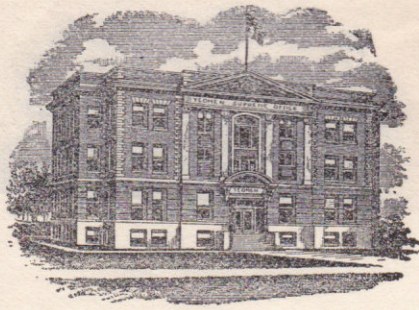
Kind Sir

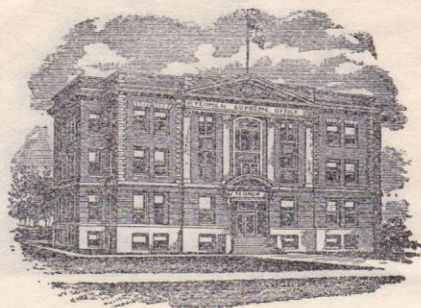
