Dear Mr. Adams:

This is to acknowledge receipt of your favor of the 21st instant, relative to providing an escort to accompany your son from Chicago to Carlisle. In reply thereto I must state that Gus Lookaround's return to school from Detroit could not be arranged as you have suggested because of the additional expense that would be involved.

For your information I will state that Ralph Tourtilotte will probably return to Carlisle for the opening day of school and that Mr. John Warrington is anxious to have his son George return here and to accomplish the enrolment of his younger son Robert. It can probably be arranged so that all the boys from Keshena and Neopit can travel together and it is suggested that you see Superintendent Nicholson or his Assistant, Mr. Marble, about plans that could be made.
