maple sugar on hand.

Of course its a little early just now, but the latter part of the month, those that go out to sugar camp will be moving, I can get all you want by next month, if you can wait that long.

I will send it as soon as I can get a hold of some I will have to order it ^{from} some clean person, they ^{are} generally quite clean. We get for our use 60 lbs of the pulverized, every year

and it lasts the year around. I make syrup with it. I have some, but its awfully dark, it is not very good, I certainly would send you some of it, but you won't like it. - Dear Nellie, I would write you a long letter, but the little boy I'm taking care of is not well and I'm writing this in a hurry. - I rec'd the invitation to the Carlisle Commencement, I get one every year, and am always happy

to get the invitation, it al-
ways brings back to memory
the pleasant years I spent
there. I wish I could go back
there to see the different changes.
Of course I don't know hardly
anyone there now. - I was
saying, I'm going next year,
if I live till then. -

Well, Nellie, I've changed
my name since you saw
me last. I've been ~~married~~
almost a year now. - Write
I shall be glad to hear from you.
