



Answering your letter of the 5th inst., with reference to the whereabouts of Martha Owl Simpson, a Cherokee Indian belonging to this reservation, and who was formerly employed at Hoopa School, California, I will say that this Office has been endeavouring to locate her for the past three years, and more especially so for the last few months, but all communications sent to her have been returned. She married a white man at Hoopa, and, after that, her whereabouts were unknown. I have inquired of her family, and find that she has communicated with none of them.
