My dear friend — We need no introduction, you have seen my name and picture many times, tho' we've never met face to face. I am almost ashamed to write to Carlisle simply because I have been silent so long, but the Carlisle Arrow has awakened me. I received a package of papers from the Onida post-office and upon opening the package they were all copies of the Arrow. I have been getting the Arrow irregularly for some time but it has always been sent to Onida but we do not get our mail there. My present address is — West De Pere, Wis. R.F.D. 2. Will you please see that my

-address is changed. I thank you very kindly for sending me this little paper, it is a great helper and encourager. I feel it a great honor to be a member of the greatest Indian school in the country.

The names of students and some ex-students are new to me but occasionally I read of an old school-mate situated somewhere in this great country of ours. It doesn't seem so long since I left Carlisle but when I read the names in the Arrow and see pictures of the school buildings I see many changes - and I know were I to visit Carlisle now the place would seem new to me. I spent many happy days at Carlisle but I do not write very often simply because I am kept so busy with my little children. I have four children the oldest one is eight and is in the Maria boarding school

I feel very anxious about him the last few days. Small pox broke out in the school and it is now under quarantine tho' yesterday my husband phoned over to the clerk and he says there is only one case. I hope it will not spread any more. The rest of my children are well and healthy.

I still have a great interest in Carlisle, as I have a sister there. Delia Denny. I hope she is doing well, I get very nice letters from her sometimes, she seems to be improving. My nephew Harrison Smith, I am sure is doing well. He stayed with me a while when he was home a year ago. I am very proud of him. I hope he will always carry himself as he did while here. Thanking you again for the Arrow and other papers from the school I wish you great success in your work.
