

Your sister did not seem to be very anxious to take the place, and as it was necessary for her to take the Civil Service examination, the delay made it possible for someone else to be appointed. I was very sorry, indeed, to hear of the death of Guy Cooley. He was a student here when I first came to Carliele and I helped him get his place in Washington. He was a boy of fine character, and I am very sorry that his life has thus been cut short. Luys room had been neglected for about two years It had not been cleaned in that length of time and Dr. Perkins admits that he was afraid to go in Guys room while he was sick

to, about Grey. They would have had it in a tent, and look turns in waiting on him. They never thoughth of doing any They took his body up to Globe, ariz, and had services and buried him up There Mr Friedman please do not give me, away for telling you this much, for I am not ready to quit my job yet, but Thought I would tell you This much, as Luy had been a Carlisle Audent, but do not know since you have been there or not. yours Respect July.
