

My dear Sir:

I have noted in your letter of November the 6th that there are reasons to believe Agnes Keshege was born in the United States and that therefore she would be entitled to enrolment at Carlisle in so far as that requirement is concerned. However, as I had to be guided altogether by the application that was placed on file with me by Miss Muir I had to refuse her admittance here because it was noted that she was born in Canada.

In this connection I will add that the desired number of students for this year's work have been enrolled and that only very specially selected students who do not have any school advantages will be received after this date. The young lady in whose behalf you wrote me is now twenty years of age and has always attended public school, and as it is the desire of the Office at Washington to aid only those students who have not had another chance to go to school and not to extend the privileges of the government schools to those who have left their tribes it would not be advisable to admit her here

even if it can be proven that she was born in the United States.

Other than the fact that she can hardly be considered entitled to an education at government expense is the lack of any information about her past record and her tendencies, so that her enrolment at Carlisle would seem to be a risk which it would not be advisable to assume.

Thanking you for the interest you have shown and hoping that the young lady can be given a chance to help herself, I remain.
