I was glad to hear from you. Hope that you are doing well. I don't know when I shall be able to get back to New York--certainly not until Congress adjourns. We are figuring now that things will close up here about August first.

I am having a very valuable and interesting experience down here as Secretary to Congressman Littleton. As you perhaps know, I was in Mr. Littleton's office before coming down here. As soon as we finish here I shall return to New York and resume my work in his office there. During the past three years I have been studying law; and this year completed the course at Georgetown University Law School. I began my study at New York Law School and entered the third year class at Georgetown this last winter. Next fall I expect to take the Bar examination in New York City and shall probably begin practicing law in Mr. Littleton's office.
