No. I wrote to Major Pratt concerning a position and never got any answer. About 5 years ago.

Worked at printer's trade about 2 years. Papermaker. Run a dray for myself.

If you consider a man, living in a town of about 35,000 people working and taking care of himself and learning the ways of the people as good as he can and helping his mother buy a house and home on the outskirts of town, doing anything for the betterment of his people, then I have, but outside of that I have done little as we have lived in town since I

came home and have seen few of our people.

12. Tell me anything else of interest connected with your life

Have always tried to get a position in the service. Wrote 2 or 3 letters to Major Pratt but received no answer so never wrote there since. I took Civil Service examination here for mail clerk in the P. O. and stood 80.7 but there was no vacancy in that allotted 6 months so when they had the next examination I had a good position in Rhinelanders with the General Paper Co. and did not try Civil Service any more. I stood the highest of the class and felt proud of that as there was about 15 in the class.
