We sold 1200 bu. of potatoes last fall and about 10,000 qts. of strawberries and raspberries last yr. We had from 50 to 75 berry pickers in the rush of the season. Our market is Buffalo, N.Y. about 25 miles from here.

And last but not least. I must tell you we have a smart little boy; he will be a year old the 26 of this mo. His name is Grant. These papers travelled around quite a while before finding me and so I send them back filled out immediately.
