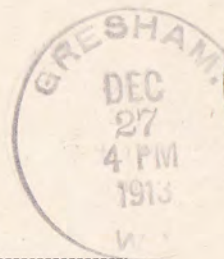

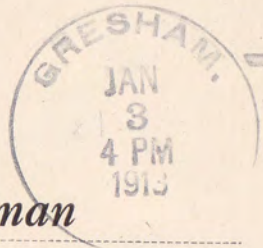

I commenced duty March 1st 1907 and am enjoying success as far as weather permits. At this time of the year here, winter is just leaving us. The roads some places almost are nothing but mud and water but I have a fair attendance.

About graduates— Mrs. Lyman Jacobs—Oliver Miller '87 has married a very industrious young man and they are getting along very well. Mrs. Florence Gardner—Florence Miller '94 was married but divorced quite well. Artie E Miller '00 is yet single and works for a large lumbering co., and is doing quite well. Samuel Brushell '03 is married and doing well. These are the only graduates I can furnish any information about. I am married have one little boy about two years old and am trying to make this the best school year ever witnessed on our reservation.

In 1904 we were unfortunate in burning

out, and lost every thing we had in the
fire, with it my diploma. Can you furnish
me with another. If possible please do so
and the same will be most highly esteemed.
