CHIPPEWA INDIAN JOINS ARMY TO AVENGE FRIEND

With a vow fresh upon his lips to avenge the death of his friend, Sergeant Theodore Peterson of Minneapolis, George Peake, a Chippewa Indian of the White Earth reservation, left Minneapolis last night for Jefferson Barracks to enter a field artillery unit.

Peake and Sergeant Peterson formerly were employed at the Andrews hotel baths in Minneapolis, and they became intimate friends. Sergeant Peterson died from wounds received on the American sector in France recently.

Chippewa Indian Goes on War Path to Avenge His Pal

George Peake, a Chippewa Indian of White Earth reservation, went on the war path yesterday to avenge the death of his friend, Sergt. Theodore Petersen, former M. A. C. swimming director who died from wounds received on the American sector in France.

Peake and Sergeant Petersen formerly were employed at the Andrews hotel baths, and there they became intimate friends. When the Indian's friend departed from Minneapolis with the First Minnesota field artillery, now the 151st regiment, en route to France, Peake said good-by at the train and solemnly delegated the sergeant to "go after" the Germans with all his might.

Friday morning the Indian read the name of Sergt. Theodore Petersen on the casualty list of those who had died of wounds, as published in The Tribune, and he made his vow to avenge his friend's death. The Spiritualist church added a fourth star to its service flag and held special services for the departing warrior. Peake left last night for Jefferson Barracks to get his uniform as a field artilleryman.
