I am in receipt of your letter asking for information concerning Mrs. Letha Kennedy of Irving, New York, who has made application for appointment to the position of Matron in the Indian Service.

I am not able from our records to answer the questions on the back of the form you enclose very fully as it has been 17 years since Mrs. Kennedy was a pupil here.

Mrs. Kennedy was a pupil here from August 31, 1899 to February 11, 1902 and was graduated in 1902. Her record while here was Good.

Our ex-students record shows that she has been keeping house and dress-making since she left the school. The records show nothing against her.
