The Indians have spend a very happy Christmas. Perhaps it would be interesting to know that the Pimas have spend what would be called a white Christmas. At least that was the expression by the whites who have witnessed the occasion. The church was most artistically decorated. Inside

were two Christmas trees on which
hung many nice things.

A few speeches were made and sing-
ing by the Day School children; Then
the Santa Claus entered gayly dressed
in red and white. Afterwards, I found
it was our own William Nelson, who
so ably carried himself for the occasion.
