SPECIAL NOTE.

This form must be executed in duplicate when a child is transferred from a reservation to a non-reservation school. The Superintendent of the nonreservation school will retain the original for his files, and the duplicate shall be deposited in the Agency records. The agent will then send to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs his certificate as provided by law. All the blanks must be properly filled in every case.

NOTE.—Age limits, fourteen to five twenty years. Preferably fourteen to 5 eighteen. Students must be at least one-fourth Indian, preferably full Indian. Special cases beyond the age limit will be given consideration. An industrial course only can be taken and the term reduced to three years, in exceptional cases.

INDORSEMENTS.

The laws relating to the transfer of Indian children from reservations and schools are as follows:

That hereafter no Indian child shall be sent from any Indian reservation to a school beyond the State or Territory in which said reservation is situated without the voluntary consent of the father or mother of such child if either of them is living, and if neither of them is living without the voluntary consent of the next of kin of such child. Such consent shall be made before the agent of the reservation, and he shall send to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs his certificate that such consent has been voluntarily given before such child shall be removed from such reservation. And it shall be unlawful for any Indian agent or other employee of the Government to induce, or seek to induce, by withholding rations or by other improper means, the parents or next of kin of any Indian to consent to the removal of any Indian child beyond the limits of any reservation. (28 Stats., p. 906.)

Provided, that hereafter no Indian child shall be taken from any school in any State or Territory to a school in any other State against its will or without the written consent of its parents. (29 Stats., p. 348.)

The rules provide that—

A pupil who has been regularly enrolled in a nonreservation school must not be taken to any other nonreservation school without the consent of both Superintendents and the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, and Superintendents will be held to strict accountability for such pupils taken to their schools.

An Indian boy or girl 18 years old and over may, without the consent of parents or others, personally sign the application form on its being changed to suit the case.

This form is to be used only in transfers from reservations, or Indian schools, to nonreservation schools.

Sir:

Reference is made to your letter of April 28, 1917, in which you direct attention to that paragraph of the Declaration of Policy in the Administration of Indian Affairs which refers to Indian students who have completed the course of instruction in the Government schools, being declared competent.

In accordance with these directions I have the honor to report that Mae Lavadore, a $\frac{1}{2}$ blood Walla Walla Indian, 17 years of age, passed her examinations and on May 24, 1917, was graduated from this school in domestic science in accordance with the old course of study.

Superintendent Swartzlander reports that Miss Lavadore has no allotment having been born subsequent to the making of all allotments there in 1891 and 1892. She has no inherited land but under recent legislation allotments will be made there to Indian entitled, not exceeding 80 acres each. Miss Lavadore will be permitted to select an allotment for herself. He reports that she is now at home with her father, living at Cayuse, Oregon. She is entitled at this time to her share of the tribal funds belonging to the Indians of that reservation; this will amount to a little more than \$250.

Mrs. Matilda G. Ewing, matron, reports that Mae is a very nice girl. She is industrious and well meaning generally. She was true to her trust and believes she will develop into a woman of more than average ability. She reports also that she has a pleasing manner, spends her money economically, and was one of the good girls of the school.

Principal Blair reports that Mae is a strong, self-reliant girl; ambitious and energetic. She is studious in her habits and attentive to details, courteous and well behaved. She is fond of reading and shows good judgment in her choice of books. She measures up, to responsibility in a way that shows strenght of character.

Miss Lavadore is amply competent to control her share of tribal trust funds as reported by the Superintendent. I hesitate, however, about recommending the removal of restrictions upon the allotment which she will receive in the future until such a time as she has had an opportunity to find herself in life. Should she marry young the handling of her land would be dependent verygreatly upon the wisdom of the young man she marries, for which reason the issue of a patent in fee on her land must be influenced by conditions in the future.

She is a magnificent girl and should she remain single or marry a man of good reputation, I would recommend the granting of a fee patent to cover any land she may acquire in the future. The papers are enclosed.
