#### INDORSEMENT.

A child showing one-sixteenth or less Indian blood, whose parents live on an Indian reservation, Indian fashion, who, if debarred from the Government schools, could not obtain an education, may be permitted in the reservation day and boarding schools, but it is preferable that it be not transferred to a nonreservation school, without permission from the Office. Children showing one-eighth or less Indian blood, whose parents do not live on an Indian reservation, whose home is among white people where there are churches and schools, who are presumed to have adopted the white man's manners and customs, and are to all intents and purposes white people, are debarred from enrollment in the Government nonreservation and reservation schools. Superintendents, in all cases where doubt exists as to the degree of Indian blood of a child proposed for transfer, should fully satisfy themselves of the facts by affidavits from reliable persons, which affidavits must be kept on file at the school.

A pupil who has been regularly enrolled in a nonreservation school must not be taken to any other nonreservation school without the consent of both Superintendents and the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, and Superintendents will be held to strict accountability for such pupils taken to their schools.

A pupil dismissed from school for cause must not be enrolled in any other school without the permission of the Commissioner of Indian Affairs. Full facts must be submitted with each request.

#### SPECIAL NOTE

This form must be executed in duplicate when a child is transferred from a reservation to a nonreservation school. The Superintendent of the nonreservation school will retain the original for his files, and the duplicate shall be deposited in the Agency records. The agent will then send to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs his certificate as provided by law. All the blanks must be properly filled in every case,

#### NOTE

Age limits, fourteen to twenty years. Preferably fourteen to eighteen. Students must be at least one-fourth Indian, preferably full Indian. Special cases beyond the age limit will be given consideration. An industrial course only can be taken and the term reduced to three years, in exceptional cases.

#### INDORSEMENTS

The laws relating to the transfer of Indian children from reservations and schools are as follows:

That hereafter no Indian child shall be sent from any Indian reservation to a school beyond the State or Territory in which said reservation is situated without the voluntary consent of the father or mother of such child if either of them are living, and if neither of them are living without the voluntary consent of the next of kin of such child. Such consent shall be made before the agent of the reservation, and he shall send to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs his certificate that such consent has been voluntarily given before such child shall be removed from such reservation. And it shall be unlawful for any Indian agent or other employee of the Government to induce, or seek to induce, by withholding rations or by other improper means, the parents or next of kin of any Indian to consent to the removal of any Indian child beyond the limits of any reservation. (28 Stats., p. 906.)

Provided, That hereafter no Indian child shall be taken from any school in any State or Territory to a school in any other State against its will or without the written consent of its parents. (29 Stats., p. 348.)

The rules provide that-

A pupil who has been regularly enrolled in a nonreservation school must not be taken to any other nonreservation school without the consent of both Superintendents and the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, and Superintendents will be held to strict accountability for such pupils taken to their schools.

An Indian boy or girl 18 years old and over may, without the consent of parents or others, personally sign the application form on its being changed to suit the case.

This form is to be used only in transfers from reservations or Indian schools to nonreservation schools.

Commissioner of Indian Affairs, Washington, D.C.

Sir:

Reference is made to your letter of April 28, 1917, in which you direct attention to that paragraph of the Declaration of Policy in the Administration of Indian Affairs which refers to Indian students over 21 years of age and who have xompleted the full course of instruction in the Government schools, being declared competent.

In accordance with these directions I have the honor to report that Amy Smith, a half blood Indian of the Round Valley Reservation, California, is shown by the records of this office to be 23 years of age, was graduated from Carlisle, having passed her examination, on May 24, 1917.

Superintendent W. W. McConihe reports that Amy Smith has to her credit on the books of his office \$7.11. She has ten acres of land allotted in the valley, the description of which is said to be - tot 40, section 25, teamship 23 N, Range 13 W., M.D.M.. She has also allotment No. 1131, being the

She also has an inherited right in the allotment No. 310 allotted to William Smith, being Lot 39 Section 25, Township 23 N. R. 13 W., M.D.M., her share being 97/630 of this ten acre allotment.

Principal Blair reports Amy Smith to be in every way one of the most capable students in the shchool this year. He says she was found on the right side of every question and was a great help in the discipline of the school. That she is a good student, has much initiative and sense of responsibility. That she is a good girl and has the respect of all who know her.

Matilda G. Ewing, Matron, reports that Amy Smith is a girl of good moral character. Has fine executive ability and is a good disciplinarian. That she always stands firmly for the right, is of kindly disposition, is loyal and true to her trust. Mrs. Ewing would mark her above the average in initiative. She is a good seamstress, also a good housekeeper, and during last summer Mrs. Ewing felt perfectly safe to leave her in charge of the girls.

Personally I consider Amy Smith a splendid example of young Indian womanhood. I am not quite sure, however, that she would have the force of character to make her own wisdom effective should she marry in the future, and

and it might therefore be that her property would be governed to a very great extent by the character of the man she marries.

It would seem, therefore, that she should have a few years in which her life might outline itself before final action is taken on the removal of her restrictions, and I so recommend.


