## SPECIAL NOTE.

This form must be executed in duplicate when a child is transferred from a reservation to a nonreservation school. The Superintendent of the nonreservation school will retain the original for his files, and the duplicate shall be deposited in the Agency records. The agent will then send to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs his certificate as provided by law. All the blanks must be properly filled in every case.

If the information called for on any part of the blank is not known, that fact should be stated. No space should be left unfilled. Whether the parents are living or dead, their names must be given.

The person who signs the blank as consenting to the transfer should indicate his relation to the applicant by marking out the word "parent," "guardian," or "next of kin," leaving unmarked only the title appropriate to the signer.

## INDORSEMENTS.

The laws relating to the transfer of Indian children from reservations and schools are as follows:
That hereafter no Indian child shall be sent from any Indian reservation to a school beyond the State or Territory in which said reservation is situated without the voluntary consent of the father or mother of such child if either of them are living, and if neither of them are living without the voluntary consent of the next of kin of such child. Such consent shall be made before the agent of the reservation, and he shall send to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs his certificate that such consent has been voluntarily given before such child shall be removed from such reservation. And it shall be unlawful for any Indian agent or other employee of the Governmẹnt to induce, or seek to induce, by withholding rations or by other improper means, the parents or next of kin of any Indian to consent to the removal of any Indian child beyond the limits of any reservation. (28 Stats., p. 906.)

Provided, That hereafter no Indian child shall be taken from any school in any State or Territory to a school in any other State against its will or without the written consent of its parents. (29 Stats., p. 348.)

The rules provide that-
A pupil who has been regularly enrolled in a nonreservation school must not be taken to any other nonreservation school without the consent of both Superintendents and the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, and Superintendents will be held to strict accountability for such pupils taken to their schools.

An Indian boy or girl 18 years old and over may, without the consent of parents or others, personally sign the application form on its being changed to suit the case; but in all cases where the parents are living they should first be consulted.

I have jour letter of july luth with reference to udia Hovermale, who graduated from your school on liay 24, 1917, and upon whom you reuest a report concerning her genernl competency under the new Declaration of Policy. This sirl is a quarter breed Assiniboin Indian, but wes removed from this reservation when she was three years old and hes since been in the care of her white brdindorrents in Minneapolis, linn. The girl's father died in an insane asylum. She is a half sister of Mrs. William licelammy who lives here in this town. Mrs. Medlammy is married to a white msin. This is practioally all the aata I can pive jou aoncerning Addie Hovermale.

Her sister was in this office today and showed me 13 letter from Addie in which she saye that she desires to return here and live with the sister as the srandparents With whon Addie has resided heretofore are about to leave Hinneapolis ana go to rexas to keep house for a danghter of theirs who lives in that state. I aannot say that I was Well pleased with the letter from Addie, as she appeared to be discontented snd dissatisfied, though that may be the manifestation of unrest common to young woman of her age. You will see from the meager data I have ooncerning this girl I gan give you little help in detemmining her competeney nd I would not want to recommend anything conceming the matter, if I supposed to do any reeommending, until I see how she conducts herself after returning fem school. Her sister desires that she come back here and live with her and unless the girl is to toke up some nork under jour direetion I suppose that will be the proper thing for her to do. The sister asks that you retum her at Govemment cost, as she has been t Cariisle long time, has nov creduated snd should returm home. Please let me know whet you will do conceming the matter as soon as possible.

Addie is the deughter of George B. and Hee Cooley Hovermale of 628 8th Ave., South Hinneapolis, Hinn. Her parents are both dead. They were faily well educated. She has worked in all the induetrial departments at Carlisle during her long e+sy iore. She likes nursing best.

Principel Blair reports thet dije is a very intelligent girl, usos excellent Bnglish, slthough she dislikss to study. She has keen intuitions, reads people acourately, and is inclined to eriticize them without regard to age or position. She is affectionste and easily led by kindness. She is a strong oharacter, capable of developing into a very useful woman.

Watilda G. Ewing is e very bright girl. Is very officient as a laundress. Has a temper that sometimes, unless guarded firmly mey giver her trouble

Addie is in good health, and spends money freely.

Addic is an allottec of the fort Peok Indian Reservation and receives annuities therefrom which are comparatively small in amount. She has not however, lived upon the resexvetion, but has been in charge of her grandparents, who live in Hinneapolis, from where she was enrolled in Carlisle.
