Age limits, fourteen to twenty years. Preferably fourteen to eighteen. Students must be at least one-fourth Indian, preferably full Indian. Special cases beyond the age limit will be given consideration. An industrial course only can be taken and the term reduced to three years, in exceptional cases.

#### INDORSEMENTS

The laws relating to the transfer of Indian children from reservations and schools are as follows:

That hereafter no Indian child shall be sent from any Indian reservation to a school beyond the State or Territory in which said reservation is situated without the voluntary consent of the father or mother of such child if either of them are living, and if neither of them are living without the voluntary consent of the next of kin of such child. Such consent shall be made before the agent of the reservation, and he shall send to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs his certificate that such consent has been voluntarily given before such child shall be removed from such reservation. And it shall be unlawful for any Indian agent or other employee of the Government to induce, or seek to induce, by withholding rations or by other improper means, the parents or next of kin of any Indian to consent to the removal of any Indian child beyond the limits of any reservation. (28 Stats., p. 906.)

Provided, That hereafter no Indian child shall be taken from any school in any State or Territory to a school in any other State against its will or without the written consent of its parents. (29 Stats., p. 348.)

The rules provide that-

A pupil who has been regularly enrolled in a nonreservation school must not be taken to any other nonreservation school without the consent of both Superintendents and the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, and Superintendents will be held to strict accountability for such pupils taken to their schools.

An Indian boy or girl 18 years old and over may, without the consent of parents or others, personally sign the application form on its being changed to suit the case.

This form is to be used only in transfers from reservations or Indian schools to nonreservation schools.

Commissioner of Indian Affairs, Washington, D.C.

Sir:

Reference is made to your letter of April 28, 1917, in which you direct attention to that paragraph of the Declaration of Policy in the Administration of Indian Affairs which refers to Indian students over 21 years of age and who have completed the full course of instruction in the Government schools, being declared competent.

In accordance with these directions I have the honor to report that Sarah Celia Monteith, a full blood Nez Perce Indian, 26 years of age, was graduated from Carlisle, having passed her examination, on May 24, 1917.

Superintendent Jacob Breid reports that Sarah Celia Monteith has a cash credit on the books of his office amounting to \$417.00. Her own allotment No. 1472, lots 14, 15, 18, and 21, Section 29, Township 32 N., Range 2 East, 80 acres, has an estimated value of \$4400.

She also has inherited interests as follows: One-third interest in allotment 1468, lots 16, 17 and 32, Sec. 29, and lot 25, Sec. 28, Twp. 32 M. Range 2 E.B.M. 80 acres. Total estimated value \$4000.

One-sixth interest in allotment 1224, lots 11, 12, 13 and 14, Sec. 28, Twp. 32 N Range 2 E 80 acres. Estimated value \$4000.

One-sixth interest in allotment 1470, lots 22, 23, 26 and 27, Sec. 28, Twp. 32 N. Range 2 E. 80 acres, estimated value \$4000.

One-sixth interest in allotment 1471, lots 19, 20, 21, 28 and 29, Sec. 28, Twp. 32 No. Range 2 E. 100 acres. Estimated value \$4800.

In addition to the above she is apparently an heir to one-half of the following property belonging to Moses Monteith, her father, recently deceased.

Allotment No. 1467 of Moses Montieth. 120 acres. Estimated value \$6000.

One-eighth interest in allotment No. 1394, containing 97.50 acres. Estimated value \$3000.

11/96 interest in allotment No. 714 containing 79.81 acfes. Estimated value \$3500.

One-third interest in allotment No. 1103 containing 100 acres. Estimated value \$4200.

One-third interest in allotment No. 1468 containing 80 acres. Estimated value \$4000.

One-sixth interest in allotment No. 1224 containing 80 acres. Estimated Value \$4000.

Two-thirds interest in allotment 1470 containing 80 acres. Estimated value \$4000.

Two-thirds interest in allotment No. 1471 containing 100 acres. Estimated value \$4800.

All of this land is located on the Nez Perce reservation.

From this it is apparent that Sarah Celia Montieth is worth approximately \$25,000.

principal Badir reports that Sarah is a quiet unassuming girl with a good character in every way.

There is nothing brilliant about her. She may be classed as fair in the ability she shows in the work of the school. She is dependable and steady in everything she does.

Matilda G. Ewing, matron, reports that Sarah

Montieth is a girl of good moral character. She is

of a very kindly but very sensitive disposition.

She stands firmly for the right as she sees it. She
has been a splendid officer during the year. Mrs.

Ewing considers her a good housekeeper and has average
ability as a seamstress.

Her English is not particularly good. I understand that she is soon to be married to a young man on the Nez Perce reservation. The manner in which her property will be handled will be governed to a very great extent by the character of her husband. In view of the large amount of property in which Sarah is interested it would seem that this full blood girl is entitled to a few years in which her life may outline itself before final action is taken to remove her restrictions, and I so recommend.


