INDORSEMENT.

A child showing one-sixteenth or less Indian blood, whose parents live on an Indian reservation, Indian fashion, who, if debarred from the Government schools, could not obtain an education, may be permitted in the reservation day and boarding schools, but it is preferable that it be not transferred to a nonreservation school, without permission from the Office. Children showing one-eighth or less Indian blood, whose parents do not live on an Indian reservation, whose home is among white people where there are churches and schools, who are presumed to have adopted the white man's manners and customs, and are to all intents and purposes white people, are debarred from enrollment in the Government nonreservation and reservation schools. Superintendents, in all cases where doubt exists as to the degree of Indian blood of a child proposed for transfer, should fully satisfy themselves of the facts by affidavits from reliable persons, which affidavits must be kept on file at the school.

A pupil who has been regularly enrolled in a nonreservation school must not be taken to any other non-reservation school without the consent of both Superintendents and the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, and Superintendents will be held to strict accountability for such pupils taken to their schools.

A pupil dismissed from school for cause must not be enrolled in any other school without the permission of the Commissioner of Indian Affairs. Full facts must be submitted with each request.





Sir:

Reference is made to your letter of April 1917, in which you direct attention to that paragraph of the Declaration of Policy in the Administration of Indian Affairs which refers to Indian students who have completed the course of instruction in the Government schools, being declared competent.

In accordance with these directions
I have the honor to report that Lyman Madison,
a 5/6 blood Pokonot Indian, 30 years of age,
passed his examinations and on May 24, 1917, was
graduated from this school in painting in
accordance with the tentative course of study.

Lyman is the son of Charles Browne and Louisa Jeffers Madison of Gay Head, Mass. His father is a sailor and both parents have a fair country school education. Coming from Massachusetts Lyman has no property whatsoever under the control of the Government. He was a poor boy and the only money he obtained while enrolled at the school was by his own efforts.

Principal Blair and Mr. Roy H. Bradley, Director of Mechanic Arts, report that Lyman is peculiar to himself. Of speculative ancestry and almost fantastic in appearance he is, notwithstanding, a character of some importance. He is a born leader, absolutely fearless in the face of opposition or difficulties. He is polished in manners, deferential to women, and has great respect for authority and position. He is studious of things only that appeal to him, is very fluent in speech and likes to talk. He is mature and makes decisions quickly.

Lyman is in good health and careful in spending money. He is now at the Ford Factory and is absolutely capable of managing his own affairs. The Government has never had any control over these Indians and no restrictions have ever been imposed upon him or his property. There can be no question but that this young man, who was major of the cadet corps here, is amply able to manage his own affairs.


