The Superintendent of the nonreservation school will retain the original for his files, and the duplicate shall be deposited in the Agency records. The agent will then send to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs his certificate as provided by law. All the blanks must be properly filled in every case.

NOTE.—Age limits, fourteen to twenty years. Preferably fourteen to eighteen. Students must be at least one-fourth Indian, preferably full Indian. Special cases beyond the age limit will be given consideration. An industrial course only can be taken and the term reduced to three years, in exceptional cases.

INDORSEMENTS.

The laws relating to the transfer of Indian children from reservations and schools are as follows:

That hereafter no Indian child shall be sent from any Indian reservation to a school beyond the State or Territory in which said reservation is situated without the voluntary consent of the father or mother of such child if either of them is living, and if neither of them is living without the voluntary consent of the next of kin of such child. Such consent shall be made before the agent of the reservation, and he shall send to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs his certificate that such consent has been voluntarily given before such child shall be removed from such reservation. And it shall be unlawful for any Indian agent or other employee of the Government to induce, or seek to induce, by withholding rations or by other improper means, the parents or next of kin of any Indian to consent to the removal of any Indian child beyond the limits of any reservation. (28 Stats., p. 906.)

Provided, that hereafter no Indian child shall be taken from any school in any State or Territory to a school in any other State against its will or without the written consent of its parents. (29 Stats., p. 348.)

The rules provide that-

A pupil who has been regularly enrolled in a nonreservation school must not be taken to any other nonreservation school without the consent of both Superintendents and the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, and Superintendents will be held to strict accountability for such pupils taken to their schools.

An Indian boy or girl 18 years old and over may, without the consent of parents or others, personally sign the application form on its being changed to suit the case.

This form is to be used only in transfers from reservations, or Indian schools, to nonreservation schools.

Sir:

Reference is made to your letter of April 28, 1917, in which you direct attention to that paragraph of the Declaration of Policy in the Administration of Indian Affairs which refers to Indian students who have completed the course of instruction in the Government schools, being declared competent.

In accordance with these directions I have the honor to report that John Flinchum, a 2 blood Choctaw Indian, 19 years of age, passed his examinations and on May 24, 1917 was graduated from this school in painting, in accordance with the tentative course of study.

John is the son of James S. and Julia Turnbull Flinchum. His home is at Gerty, Okla. Both father and mother completed the grammer school course. He has about 340 acres of land much of which is in cultivation. He worked on the farm and in the carpenter shop at Armstrong Academy and since coming to Carlisle has worked in the paint shop continuously. He thinks his life's work should be on the farm as he has a good farm and likes it.

Principal Blair and Director of Mechanic Arts Bradley reports that John came to Carlisle two years ago. He is an impulsive well-meaning boy who has not yet learned to count the cost. He is not studious, has a poor command of language, and is very careless in his work, but he is particular about his personal appearance, very gentlemanly, and easily led by kindness. He is strong physically and very fond of sports. Although thoughtless he is frank and truthful, know his weaknesses and is trying to overcome them. He improved very much during the last six months. He is a very good painter and is capable of managing his own affairs.

John is in good health. He is inclined to spend his money freely.

Superintendent Parker of the Five Civilized Tribes reports in commection with the land owned by John that he is only 2 blood, and is of the unrestricted class.
