INDORSEMENTS.

The laws relating to the transfer of Indian children from reservations and schools are as follows:

That hereafter no Indian child shall be sent from any Indian reservation to a school beyond the State or Territory in which said reservation is situated without the voluntary consent of the father or mother of such child if either of them is living, and if neither of them is living without the voluntary consent of the next of kin of such child. Such consent shall be made before the agent of the reservation, and he shall send to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs his certificate that such consent has been voluntarily given before such child shall be removed from such reservation. And it shall be unlawful for any Indian agent or other employee of the Government to induce, or seek to induce, by withholding rations or by other improper means, the parents or next of kin of any Indian to consent to the removal of any Indian child beyond the limits of any reservation. (28 Stats., p. 906.)

Provided, that hereafter no Indian child shall be taken from any school in any State or Territory to a school in any other State against its will or without the written consent of its parents. (29 Stats., p. 348.)

The rules provide that-

A pupil who has been regularly enrolled in a nonreservation school must not be taken to any other nonreservation school without the consent of both Superintendents and the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, and Superintendents will be held to strict accountability for such pupils taken to their schools.

An Indian boy or girl 18 years old and over may, without the consent of parents or others, personally sign the application form on its being changed to suit the case.

This form is to be used only in transfers from reservations, or Indian schools, to nonreservation schools.

Sir:

Reference is made to your letter of April 28, 1917, in which you direct attention to that paragraph of the Declaration of Indian Affairs which refers to Indian students who have completed the course of instruction in the Government schools, being declared competent.

In accordance with these directions I have the honor to report that Hattie McAfee a full blood Choctaw Indian, 21, years of age, passed her examination and on May 24, 1917 was graduated from this school in Home Economics, in accordance with the tentative course of study.

Hattie is the daughter of Louis Mitchell LeFlore and Selina Battice of Idabel, Okla. Her father is a farmer and is a self-educated man while the mother has no education. She has worked in the sewing room most of the time since coming here but likes Domestic Science best. She desires to be a homemaker.

Principal Blair reports that Hattie has been at Carlisle nearly two years. She is very good in academic work, although somewhat timid and lacking in self-confidence. She is honorable in keeping a promise or an engagement, refined, and very affectionate toward her parents. She has great respect for authority and knows how to mind.

Matilda G. Helingtheports that Hattie is a young lady of splendid principle, but is somewhat slow, but it absolutely dependable.

Superintendent Parker reports that Hattie owns 291.26 acres of land. She is in good health and is very careful in spending money.

In view of the fact that Hattie has a great deal of Indian blood, and sowns some property, it would seem that if she should marry her future would depend upon the character of the man she marries. I do not think advisable to remove the restrictions upon her land until she has had greater opportunity to find herself.
