SPECIAL NOTE.

This form must be executed in duplicate when a child is transferred from a reservation to a non-reservation school. The Superintendent of the nonreservation school will retain the original for his files, and the duplicate shall be deposited in the Agency records. The agent will then send to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs his certificate as provided by law. All the blanks must be properly filled in every case.

NOTE.—Age limits, fourteen to twenty years. Preferably fourteen to eighteen. Students must be at least one-fourth Indian, preferably full Indian. Special cases beyond the age limit will be given consideration. An industrial course only can be taken and the term reduced to three years, in exceptional cases.

INDORSEMENTS.

The laws relating to the transfer of Indian children from reservations and schools are as follows:

That hereafter no Indian child shall be sent from any Indian reservation to a school beyond the State or Territory in which said reservation is situated without the voluntary consent of the father or mother of such child if either of them is living, and if neither of them is living without the voluntary consent of the next of kin of such child. Such consent shall be made before the agent of the reservation, and he shall send to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs his certificate that such consent has been voluntarily given before such child shall be removed from such reservation. And it shall be unlawful for any Indian agent or other employee of the Government to induce, or seek to induce, by withholding rations or by other improper means, the parents or next of kin of any Indian to consent to the removal of any Indian child beyond the limits of any reservation. (28 Stats., p. 906.)

Provided, that hereafter no Indian child shall be taken from any school in any State or Territory to a school in any other State against its will or without the written consent of its parents. (29 Stats., p. 348.)

The rules provide that-

A pupil who has been regularly enrolled in a nonreservation school must not be taken to any other nonreservation school without the consent of both Superintendents and the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, and Superintendents will be held to strict accountability for such pupils taken to their schools.

An Indian boy or girl 18 years old and over may, without the consent of parents or others, personally sign the application form on its being changed to suit the case.

This form is to be used only in transfers from reservations, or Indian schools, to nonreservation schools.

Commissioner of Indian Affairs, Washington, D.C.

Sir:

Reference is made to your letter of April 28, 1917, in which you direct attention to that paragraph of the Declaration of Policy in the Administration of Indian Affairs which refers to Indian students who have completed the course of instruction in the Government schools, being declared competent.

In accordance with these directions
I have the honor to report that wilford Eshelman, a \(\frac{1}{2}\) blood Pawnee Indian, 19 years of age,
passed his examinations and on May 24, 1917,
was graduated from this school in engineering
following the studies prescribed in the tentative course.

Ralph P. Stanion, Superintendent of the Pawnee Indian Agency, reports that Wilford Eshelmen has no land or interest on his reservation and no other tribal interests than the neeproportionate interests in the Pawnee Trust Fund and annuities. Such trust funds approximate \$500, which the may withdraw upon the attainment of his majority. The annuity provides for the payment of between \$40 and \$50 per cepita yearly.

The mother of Wilford has recently made application for a patent in fee to her allotment which was approved. Mrs. Eshelman will still have a 1/6 interest in an 80 acre allotment. The father is reported as an industrious white man who maintains his residence in the town of Pawnee. He is employed quite regularly as a laborer. The mother was a graduate of Carlisle. Before coming to Carlisle Wilford worked in a meat shop, a grocery store, and a bicycle repair shop.

Principal Blair and Mr. Bradlay,
Director of Mechanic Arts, report that Wilford
Eshelman is a fun lowing boy full of boyish
pranks, but straightforward and honest. He has
a special aptitude for machinery and is a fair
plumber. His ambition is to be an electrical
engineer. He is not studious but he has plenty
of ability and knows the value of academic training and applies himself accordingly. They report
that he is intensely proud of his little sister
who far surpasses him in classroom work; her
influence stirred him to effort when from choice
he would idle away the time or indulge in some
favorite sport.

Wilford is in good health. He is inclined to spend his money freely.

In view of the record I feel that this young man is as fully capable of managing his own affairs as any person of similar age, and any steps necessary to declare him competent should be taken as soon as practicable.
